When she first moved to Oregon, she worked in the Oregon fruit and vegetable canneries and the Oregon Department of Revenue Service. Dean's work with IBM transferred them to Sioux City, Iowa shortly after they got married. They lived in Sioux City for three years and IBM transferred the family back to Portland, Oregon. Betty was active in her church ministries, golf club, quilting club and Red Hat Society. Betty Lou was known for her fabulous cooking and baking.
