Dorothy Lenhart was born January 1, 1924 in Norden, Nebraska to Brack C. and Cora C. (Osbourne) Cornett. She was the ninth of twelve children. The family moved to Oregon when she was 16. In 1944 Dorothy married Rodney Lenhart and worked in a float plant until the end of WWII. After Rodney was discharged from the Navy, they bought a house in Dundee. Dorothy loved working in the yard and growing flowers. People often stopped and commented on her fuchsias. She worked for the Newberg School District for 35 years, as a cook at Dundee Grade School, Mable Rush, and Renne Junior High. She was known for her cinnamon rolls.

In 2001 she moved to Friendsview. She had many friends and continued gardening until her eyesight failed a couple of years ago.

Dorothy was preceded in death by her husband Rodney, sisters; Zollie, Edith, Mildred, Irene and Virginia, brothers; Paul, Donald, Derald, Howard and Joe.

She is survived by daughters; Marilyn (Larry) Bell, Cheryl (Kenneth) Johnson, three grandchildren, 6 great-grandchildren, sister Marian Johnson and numerous nieces and nephews.
