Leo grew up and attended schools in New York. After graduation he enlisted in United States Navy and served during the Korean War. During his time of service he worked at the National Security Agency in Washington D.C. On December 29, 1973 he married Judy Elmlund in Reno, Nevada. They lived in Dundee and then moved to Newberg where they made their home. Leo owned the "Gateway Inn", which he renamed the "Some Place Else Tavern", located at the west end of Newberg. Upon his retirement he was able to focus more on the things he loved. He was an avid reader and also enjoyed his daily crossword puzzles. Leo was a gun and car enthusiast, he took pride in his 1957 Corvette and 2010 Dodge Hemi Charger. He often took deep sea fishing trips and always enjoyed unique foods and sharing meals with friends and family. On Monday, August 22, 2011, Leo S. Mitzkowski died at his residence when he was eighty years, two months and two days of age. Surviving and left to honor his life are: his two sons David Mitzkowski of Clackamas, Oregon and Paul B.
