Aleksandr (Sasha) G. Melnik was born on 12/08/1956 in Shakhtarsk, Ukraine and died on 02/28/2018 in Portland, Oregon, United States.

Aleksandr was born in Ukraine, in a small mining town of Shakhtarsk to his father Gregoriy and mother Maria. His father was a miner, his mother a housewife, both had no formal education. As an ambitious young man Aleksandr went on to medical school in Donetsk, Ukraine, where he met his wife Elena. They had two children, a daughter Julie and a son Aleksey. In 1997 Aleksandr and his family immigrated to the United States and settled in Sherwood, Oregon where they have lived ever since. He started out as an entry level warehouse worker at a local package manufacturing business and thanks to his unique skill set was able to progress to being a design engineer. He loved to travel, loved to work on home improvement projects, loved soccer, and never stopped loving his country of birth. More than anything he loved being a grandfather to his granddaughter Sophie. In 2014 Aleksandr was diagnosed with advanced stage cancer and passed away at the age of 61 on Wednesday, February 28th, 2018. He is survived by his wife Elena, two children, and a granddaughter. 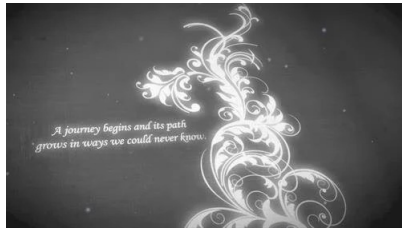
