In Loving Memory of Alice Fay Gideon Alice Fay Gideon was born the daughter of Edgar and Flora (Allen) Watson on Thursday, September 20, 1923 in Twin Falls, Idaho. Alice grew up in Twin Falls and began her school years. The family moved several times, and she went to high school in Sacramento, California. Alice was married to Don Allen and they moved to Oregon and made their home on Parrett Mountain. Don preceded her in death in March 1962, and she married Lee "Frank" Franklin Gideon in Reno, Nevada on March 30, 1974. Lee preceded her in death April 30, 1996. Alice worked in a cannery, at Frontier Leather, and at Tektronix until she retired. She enjoyed playing cards, hunting, fishing, gardening, league bowling, and being with her family. On Saturday, August 31, 2013, Alice Fay Gideon died at her residence when she was eighty-nine years, eleven months and eleven days of age.
