BRUCE D. DIXON Bruce D. Dixon was born the son of Elbert and Bobbie (Layton) Dixon on Saturday, August 16, 1924 in Wayne, Oklahoma. Bruce grew up and attended school in Oklahoma then served a term in the U.S. Army in the South Pacific during World War II. After his honorable discharge Bruce made his home in Portland where he met Grace Olson. They were married on April 26, 1946 and made their home in Portland and Tigard before coming to Dundee thirty-eight years ago. Bruce worked as a farmer and logger, then owned and operated City Tire and Battery in Newberg. After he sold his business, he went into real estate sales. Boating, playing golf, fishing and traveling were favorite pastimes. They enjoyed a trip to Europe and spending time at their condo in Hawaii. For the past twelve years they have attended Beaverton Foursquare Church. On Monday, March 26, 2012 Bruce Dixon died at a Newberg Hospital when he was 87 years, 7 months and 10 days of age. Surviving and left to honor his life are: His wife, Grace, of Dundee; one son, Gary and his wife, Julie, of Woodinville, Washington; one daughter, Jana Hopkins and her husband, David, of Lake Oswego; three grandchildren, Justin, Kelsie and Chloe; one great-granddaughter, Nicholet; and those who have come to know and appreciate him where he has lived and worked.
