Carolyn graduated from Punahou High School in Honolulu, Hawaii in 1961. She received her Associate of Arts degree from Gulf Park College in Gulf Port, Mississippi. After receiving her degree she returned to Hawaii where she became the Executive Secretary for the General Manager at Mauna Kea Beach Hotel in Kamuela, Hawaii. Carolyn later moved to Sunriver to work for her sister and brother-in-law at Bennington Properties. On Wednesday, August 28, 2013, Carolyn Wallis Cooke died at her residence when she was seventy years, two months and eleven days of age.
