In 1994 she went to work for DCI where she retired in 2009. Her family and friends were very important to her and she enjoyed spending time with them, as well as fishing, camping, watching movies and Nascar. She was a volunteer for Faith in Action before being diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease in 2012.

Connie was preceeded in death by her husband Edgar Hewitt Thornton Jr. Left to honor her memory are her four children, Todd Thornton, Troy Thornton, Travis Thornton and Tracie Thornton Feenstra, 10 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.

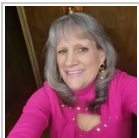

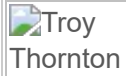

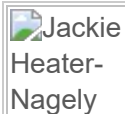
