David Clark freeman was born on Tuesday, October 27, 1953 in Stockton, California. David grew up and went to school in California graduating from Montgomery High School in Santa Rosa. He attended college and graduated from Sonoma State University in 1976 with a Degree in Education. On Tuesday, July 12, 2011, David Clark Freeman died at a local care facility, when he was fifty-seven years, nine months and sixteen days of age.
