



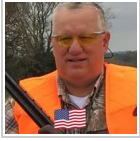
Debra Lee Saddoris

In Memory of Debra Lee Saddoris Debra Lee Saddoris was born the daughter of Harry, Jr., and Lily Mae “Lou” (Hollaway) Saddoris on Tuesday, September 4, 1956 in Redmond, Oregon. Debra grew up and attended schools in Redmond, Oregon before moving to Newberg in 1968. She graduated from Newberg High School in 1974 and then enlisted in the U.S. Navy. Debra served her country for six years, and then transferred to the Naval Reserves. She enrolled at Portland State University, where she received her business degree in 1984. After college she worked several different jobs, A-Dec and a travel agency were a couple of them. Debra toured Europe twice. She loved to learn and enjoyed spending time with her family, especially on the holidays. For the last three-and-a-half years she has been battling cancer, always with a positive attitude. On Tuesday, March 30, 2010, Debra Lee Saddoris died at a Portland hospital when she was fifty-three years, six months and twenty-six days of age. Surviving and left to honor her life are: three brothers, Richard H. Saddoris of Dundee, Roger J. “Rocky” and Robert T. Saddoris both from Newberg; her sister Diana Lou Paolo of Yamhill; her aunt, Patti Miller of Redmond; cousins; forty-seven nieces and nephews, and those who have come to know and appreciate her where she has lived and worked.
