He passed away from heart failure surrounded by family and friends on Wednesday, March 19, 2014. He married Erma Louise Kent on June 9 1946; she died April 21, 1981. He married Evelyn Oliver Hansen November 5, 1983. Doyle is preceded in death by his parents, Erma, and siblings, Beulah Monk, Kenneth McAninch, Edna Heaston and Ida Nielsen. He is survived by Karen Sue McAninch and Alberta LaRae McAninch Kindle (Mike), grandchildren Jonathan Kindle, Jim Kindle (Becky), Joseph Kindle, great grandchildren, Kayla and CJ , nieces and nephews and his wife, Evelyn. Doyle graduated from Oregon College of Education (now Western Oregon College) with a degree in teaching. During his career in education he held teaching and principal positions; his first teaching assignment was at Edwards School in Newberg, Oregon, followed by Dundee Elementary as teacher and principal, Central Elementary as principal, Mable Rush Elementary as principal, and completed his career as teacher at Dundee Elementary where he retired. He enjoyed seeing and visiting with former students which he always called "his kids." Doyle was also an active 50 year member of the Masons in Newberg

and McMinnville and long time active member of Newberg United Methodist Church. After retiring from education, he and his wife became campground hosts, and he picked up newspapers for recycling. He also became a volunteer at Newberg Providence Hospital and for Meals On Wheels, both delivering meals and preparing them in the kitchen. He was also named Volunteer of the Year in Newberg and for several years he looked forward to the monthly coffee get-togethers with former teachers. A long time resident of Newberg, Doyle will be remembered for his caring, loving and helpful attitude, his love of life and family, his sense of humor and giving back to the community that had been so good to him and his family. We will remember him as our "saint". He will forever be remembered in our hearts and thoughts every day.
