Born June 1, 1932 to Jack & Ethel Herberger.

Dwyn Anne attended St. Vincent's Catholic Elementary School and graduated from Sacred Heart Academy. Her first job, at age 14, was with the Woolworth Department Store where she worked after school and on weekends. Later, she learned her office skills while employed at Master Service Stations until she went to work for Dr. Richard Upjohn as his medical secretary and chair-side assistant.

Dwyn Anne was married to Joseph Adams with whom she had five children. They resided in the Portland area which allowed Dwyn Anne to continue classes at Marylhurst and PCC. She was the first parent in Oregon to home-school her two youngest children for several years and was a founding board member as well as the first school principal of a private school near Hillsboro, OR. A devout Roman Catholic, she was the first woman to sit on the board of Catholic Charities and served two years as board chairman of Catholic Services for Children. She was elected president of University of Oregon Medical School Faculty Wives Club and a member at large of the Clackamas County Mental Health Inc. and the Metro Mental Health Division.

From 1974 - 1986 Dwyn Anne was the Executive Director of the Oregon

Optometric Association and its full-time lobbyist at the Oregon Legislature. After that she moved to Southern California where she was employed as the Executive Director of the Orange County Dental Society. She later returned to Oregon and became a Realtor in Portland, OR.

In 2001 Dwyn Anne married Ed Hemann, her “first date” back in 1946, and they resided in Salem, OR. She is survived by her children Deborah Eaton, Mark (Donna) Adams, David Adams, Eric (Kathy) Adams, Colleen (Larry) Martin, Craig (Colleen) Hemann and Scott Hemann. Grandchildren include: Dustin, Bradley and Matthew Eaton; Craig and Marissa Adams; Brandon and Alex Adams; Nicolas Martin; Nicolas, Matthew, Bradley, Joey, Jeffrey and Adam Hemann.
