Emerson Noble Walton Emerson Noble Walton was born the son of Amos and Florence (Fleming) Walton on July 28, 1921 in Quincy, Iowa. Emerson attended school in Iowa, Nebraska, and Oregon. His family moved to Oregon in 1937. After serving four years in the US Coast Guard during WWII, Emerson married Margaret Stellflug Jones on October 17, 1946 in Newberg. He earned his solo pilot's license at the Whitney Airport, before starting work at the local pulp mill. He began at Spaulding Pulp and Paper Mill in 1946, and continued working at the local mill as a pipefitter, until his retirement from Publisher's Paper Company in December of 1983. During Emerson's years at the paper mill, he could also be found traveling around town with his tractor, doing custom garden work for people in Newberg. He was always happy riding on his tractor or one of his horses. He enjoyed his horses and mules, and was a member of the Yamhill County Sheriff's Posse for many years. On Thursday, January 6, 2011 Emerson Walton died at his residence when he was eighty- nine years, five months, and nine days of age. Surviving and left to honor his life are: his wife Margaret of Newberg; his son Wayne Walton of Newberg, two daughters Darlene Looney and Althea Kris of Newberg; his sister Shirley Schaad of Canby, his brother Edgar Walton of Portland; 11 grandchildren, twenty-five great-grandchildren, and 1 great-great-grandchild and those who have come to know and appreciate him where he has lived and worked. He was preceded in death by five sisters. His Funeral Service will be held Tuesday, January 11, 2011, at 1:00 p.m. in Attrell's

Newberg Funeral Chapel, a Golden Rule Funeral Home. Committal Service will follow at Valley View Memorial Park.
