OBITUARY INFORMATION: Ernestine McPherson Ernestine McPherson was born the daughter of Ernest and Cora (Moses) Englebretson on Wednesday, September 17, 1924 in Williston, North Dakota. On July 16, 1943 Ernestine married William H. McPherson in Haver, Montana. They moved to Portland in 1945 where they lived and raised their family until 1971 upon their retirement. They moved to Wilsonville making this their final home. Ernestine very much enjoyed crocheting, making booties which were donated to the local hospitals for newborn babies, also making stocking hats that were donated to Missionaries who served in Mexico. She also assisted with the scouting program alongside her husband. On Wednesday, July 13, 2011, Ernestine W. McPherson died at her residence when she was eighty-six years, ten months and twenty-eight days of age. Surviving and left to honor her life are: Four sons, William H. McPherson of Portland, Bruce McPherson of Seattle, Washington, Brian McPherson of Wilsonville, and Rodney McPherson of Wilsonville; ten grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; numerous nieces and nephews and those who have come to know and appreciate her where she has lived and worked. Her husband William H. McPherson preceded her in death. Her Memorial Service will be Wednesday, July 20, 2011 at 11:00 AM in Hope Fellowship Church, Wilsonville, with Rev. James Lincoln officiating.
