October 20, 1911 - February 28, 2014

In Loving Memory Golden Phay Oct. 20, 1911 – Feb. 28, 2014 Golden Phay, 102, of Wilsonville died Feb. 28 in Wilsonville. She was born to James Harry and Agnes Clayton in Spokane, Washington. Golden grew up traveling by covered wagon with her parents, brothers, and extended family from Seattle to Spokane as they followed the crops. They would spend winters in Seattle. Golden was a good student even though she was seldom able to attend school until after the harvest season in the fall and they would leave before school was out for summer vacation. Golden's family moved to Portland circa 1924. She played trombone in the Salvation Army Band. Golden attended LIFE Bible College in Los Angeles where she met Dan Phay. They were married on June 21, 1931 at Angeles Temple by Aimee Semple McPherson. Dan and Golden traveled as evangelists for several years and then pastored churches in: Hawthorne, California; Mt. Vernon, Ohio; Caldwell, Idaho; Vancouver, B.C.; Boise, Idaho; and Dallas, Oregon. Dan and Golden were the pastors of the Dallas Foursquare Church from 1966 until they retired in 1976. Golden lived in Dallas until 2003 when she moved to King City and then to Wilsonville. She was preceded in death by her husband, Dan on June 6, 1987; brother, Roy Harry; brother, Loren Harry; and brother, Marshall Harry. Survivors include her son, Daron Phay; daughter Karen (Phay) Betschart; grandchildren Annette (Betschart) Keen, Angela (Phay) Anderson, Alicia (Phay) Anderson, Jennifer Betschart, and Matthew Betschart; and 10 great grandchildren.
