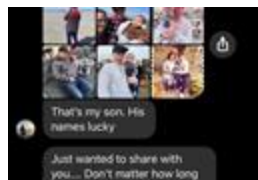
I love you Greg and always have, now you rest and watch over your children and Misty. Tell your uncle Jeff hi for me kiddo.
