OBITUARY INFORMATION: Hattie B. Schwinkendorf Hedwig "Hattie" B. Schwinkendorf was born the daughter of Richard, and Louise (Munder) Baumgarten on Friday, March 20, 1914 in Judson, North Dakota. Hattie grew up and attended school in Judson, North Dakota. On March 26, 1932 she married Waldemar Schwinkendorf in New Salem, North Dakota. Then they made their way to Portland and in 1942 they moved to Newberg where they made their home. Hattie worked at the Springbrook Cannery for 10 years. She was a homemaker who loved gardening, knitting, crocheting and spending time with her family. Hattie also enjoyed playing cards with her friends and was a great Rummy player. On Friday, October 29, 2010, Hattie B. Schwinkendorf died at her residence when she was ninety-six years, seven months and nine days of age.
