



Helen Audrie Eubanks

November 13, 1917 - July 11, 2010

Helen Eubanks was born the daughter of Ermyl, and Ethel (Stark) Buell on Sunday, November 13, 1917 in Camas, Washington. Helen grew up in Camas, Washington and later attended Willamina Schools. She moved to Newberg for a while and then to Spokane, Washington. She attended secretary school and worked at Woolworths during WWII. Helen married Billy Joe Eubanks, Sr. in 1952 and became a homemaker. Helen and Billy remained in the Spokane area until they moved to Newberg in 1962. In 1969 she began her career working for A-dec. She was the first woman to work in A-dec's machine shop. Helen retired in 1985 and moved to Amity, Oregon where she volunteered for the Newberg School District for 12 years. After the death of her husband Billy Joe in 1994 she returned to Newberg. She was an avid reader, enjoyed needle point, quilting, walking, puzzles and was a very good cook. Helen devoted herself to her family. On Sunday, July 11, 2010, Helen Audrie Eubanks died at a care center in Wilsonville when she was ninety-two years, seven months and twenty-eight days of age.
