He was a proud member of the Alpha Tau Omega fraternity. He received his degree in pharmacy and upon college graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force for four years. Hank was the pharmacy officer at Warner Robins Air Force base in Georgia and achieved the rank of Captain. He owned and ran Flanders Pharmacy and then NW Professional Pharmacy for over 40 years prior to retiring. Hank married Linda Lemonds on December 31, 1965. They had two sons, Matthew and Patrick, and they raised their children in Oak Hills. Later, the two moved to a home with acreage in Newberg, OR.
