



Howard O. Tribbett

March 21, 1935 - January 18, 2022

Howard Tribbett passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on January 18th, 2022, at 86 years of age. Howard is survived by his loving wife Jackie of 65 years, daughter Tracie (Scott), son Mark (Anne-Marie), six grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

Howard was born in Denver, CO to Nelson and Marian (Greene) Tribbett. The Tribbett family moved to Oregon in 1939. Every summer Howard would return to Yuma, CO, and spend time with his grandparents and playing with his many cousins. After graduating from Newberg High school in 1953 he attended Oregon State University, where he studied agriculture. Howard married his high school sweetheart, Jackie Gainer October 13, 1956. In 1957 he was drafted to the army as a cryptographer. Upon his return he and his father farmed together in St. Paul for 15 years, before joining the ground's team at A-dec, retiring after 23 years of service.

Howard was a Boy Scout Master of Troop 693 and a very active member of the First United Methodist Church, as well as FISH volunteer and board member for many years. He was named Newberg's Volunteer of the Year in 2007.

Howard will always be remembered by his family and friends as being generous with his time, love, and attention, and serving his country with

honor.

He was preceded in death by his parents.
