For the next 30 years she taught at Sherwood High school while she coached track and field, softball and volleyball, of which one team went to the state playoffs. She played in various sports in high school as well as field hockey, volleyball, basketball and softball at Linfield. Iola was also a college volleyball official. She was a member of the Manette Community Church, Bremerton, Washington.

After retirement she helped in large "Kil-Mar" Acres which included hay, small band of sheep, registered herd of Ayrshire cattle and a well established herd of Boer goats.
