“ Jerry was literally my right hand for almost 5 years as we served in the Bishopric for Lakeridge Ward, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. I could always count on Jerry to teach any class, lead any discussion, or even direct a choir whenever those needs arose. I still remember so vividly when I came to Jerry and explained that the stake had asked our Ward to provide the choir music for upcoming stake conference. I added my own challenge to the task by sharing with Jerry I really felt it was important we have about 50 singers--and I wanted them to come from our Ward. The easier path would have been to make it a two-ward choir, but Jerry agreed that because it was our ward which had been asked it should be our ward to carry out the assignment.
