



Jonathan Thomas Appel

November 23, 1970 - April 27, 2022

Jonathan Thomas Appel died peacefully in his sleep in his home in Newberg, Oregon on April 12, 2022 from complications suffered after a car accident in 2005 that left him with a traumatic brain injury for the past 17 years.

Jon was born in Astoria, Oregon, on November 23rd, 1970. A natural athlete as a young man, he was gifted in baseball, football, basketball, and found a love for weightlifting. Upon graduation from Oregon City High School in 1989, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, where he deployed in combat in support of Operation Desert Storm and operations in North Africa. After serving four years and receiving his honorable discharge from the USMC, Jon continued to serve as a non-commissioned officer in the Oregon Army National Guard as a recruiter and as a logistics specialist as a civilian. Jon was quiet yet extremely proud of his service in the Marines and Army, which came to define so much of his view on life. His physical stature and strength were matched only by his love of living, energy, confidence, gigantic hugs, and his unique ability to make anyone laugh and feel at ease.

He was an extremely proud father of his children, but also adored his nieces and nephews, who know him as Uncle Jon, a larger-than-life presence that endures after his death. After his accident, he was left 100% disabled but no less a warrior, demonstrating an incalculable will to live by surviving for 17 years under the vigilant care of his mother, family, and a team of dedicated

caregivers.

Jon is survived by his three children, Zachary, Haleigh, and Michael, his mother Barbara, and his 5 siblings, Mary, Justin, Joseph, Amanda, and Rachel. Jon's father, Thomas, passed away in 2017.

Jon will be laid to rest next to his father at Valley View Memorial Park on April 30, 2022.
