Patricia's family moved to San Andres, California after her birth and lived there for nineteen years, where she graduated from High School. She then attended Sacramento City College where she joined the Phi Epsilon Phi club. After graduating, Patricia attended College of the Pacific for only a short period of time before returning home to care for her mother. She married Louis Paul Pettigrew in 1940 in Carson City, Nevada then moved to San Francisco and then back to Sacramento where she lived most of her life. Patricia worked for the State of California's Department of Transportation for twenty plus years where she retired. In August of 2003 Louis and she moved to Sherwood. Louis passed away January 4, 2005. Patricia remained in the area living at several assisted living facilities. She was an avid music lover, she also loved traveling, being with her family, especially her boys. On Tuesday, March 16, 2010, Leah Patricia Pettigrew died when she was ninety-two years, two months and twenty-three days of age.
