Leila lived her entire life in Newberg, attending the local grade schools and graduating from Newberg High school in 1942. In September of 1943 she married her high school sweetheart, Thomas F. McGinnis in San Francisco, California. She worked at US National Bank in Newberg and later as a purchasing agent for Sartron in Newberg for 21 years. Leila was a former member and past President of the VFW Auxiliary and former member of Vesta Rebekah Lodge No. 76. She was a volunteer with the Newberg Charitable Organization for over 13 years working in the gift shop at both the old and new Newberg Hospitals. She also knitted baby sweaters for sale in the gift shop along with her good friend, Nadine McLain. Her hobbies included reading, gardening, and she excelled at sewing and all forms of needlework. She also enjoyed spending time with her family and was much loved by all who knew her. On Saturday, January 29, 2011, Leila Aurelia McGinnis died at Portland Care Center when she was eighty-six years, zero months and four days of age.
