Leroy Franklin Barnhart, 95, of Newberg, passed away on Wednesday, August 10, 2022, surrounded by his wife and seven children. Roy was preceded in death by his parents, Leroy and Rachel; siblings Phyllis, Robert, and Carolyn; and his first wife, Jackie.

As a lifelong electrician and business owner, he never failed to share his faith in Jesus. He was involved in many churches and ministries throughout his life. In 1971, the family moved to Mountaindale, Oregon to establish a place where people have enjoyed God and his creation. After retirement, he loved to use his vocational skills at Young Life camps in Oregon and British Columbia. At 75, he fulfilled a lifelong dream to become a pilot and own a small airplane. Roy fell in love with Donna Macintosh whom

he married in 2013. His legacy continues.
