Lucille grew up in Webster, South Dakota and graduated from high school. On May 2, 1947 she married Ruben E. Wolff in South Dakota. Ruben served a term in the military and when he returned they made their home in South Dakota until 1951 when they moved to Newberg. Lucille worked at the Hudson Nut Plant in Dundee and then at View Master in Progress. Ruben died January 4, 1986. She then made her home in Sherwood for a while. Nine years ago she decided to move to Prineville to live with her daughter and then to Baker City four years ago. Lucille enjoyed canning, cooking and making candy for her family especially at Christmas time. On Sunday, April 10, 2011, Lucille Lorraine Wolff died at her residence when she was eighty-three years, two months and sixteen days of age.
