Marsha was born in London, England in 1946 where she lived with her family in a post-World War II environment. She lived in various locations around London until she was 22 years old.

Marsha met her future husband John while he was stationed in London with the US Navy. She moved to the USA to be with John and they married in 1971. John had a son, Anthony from a previous marriage whom Marsha lovingly helped raise. In 1975, John and Marsha had a daughter, Wendy, and the family settled in Downey, CA. They stayed happily married until he unexpectedly passed away from a Heart Attack in 1987. Marsha never remarried and continued her focus on living the "good life" with family and friends. In 1995 Marsha very proudly became an American Citizen. In 2004 she moved to Oregon to be closer to her daughter, son and grandchildren. Marsha got the greatest joy in life from being a Grandma and actively playing a role in their lives. With declining health, Marsha moved in with her daughter Wendy, son-in-law Aaron and grandchildren, Keoni and Cydney who were able to care for and nurture Marsha for 5 years before her passing. What a blessing that was for all of us.

Marsha was one of the strongest people you'll meet in mind, body, and spirit. Although, she was challenged by extreme health conditions like Multiple Sclerosis, Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma, and Heart Failure she never once gave up hope or fight since her first diagnosis in 1988. What she wasn't able to do with her body, she made up for in her ability to connect and give unconditional love.

Marsha loved music, dancing, the beach, UK culture, Queen Elizabeth, comedy movies

and shows, live musicals and plays, Jewish deli food, bakeries, English Fine China, QVC, anything to do with Italy, and volunteering with community organizations. She Facebook Messengered her sister daily in England and they would talk for hours. Family gatherings with her children and grandchildren were her favorites. She was loving and loyal to her family and friends. she was very proud of her Jewish roots. It was very important to her to share the history of the Jews and the Holocaust and to make sure that history does not repeat itself. She was an active member in her local Jewish temples throughout her life. Marsha loved all animals, especially dogs of whom she had several companions over the course of her life.

- Daughter Wendy, husband Aaron, and their two children Keoni and Cydney of Newberg, Oregon.
