



Mickey Lee Peppmeier

October 20, 1945 - March 20, 2016

Mick Peppmeier, of Sherwood Oregon, died March 20, 2016 at the age of 70. Mick was born October 20, 1945 in Osceola, Iowa and moved to Oregon with his family at the age of 11. Mick was a 1963 graduate of Tigard High School. He was a dedicated employee (always the first one in and last one out!) at Cascade Pools and Spas for 36 years before retiring in 2014.

Husband, father, grandfather, brother, friend and neighbor...Mick was the rock. He was always willing to share his time and his skills (and there were many). The man could fix anything. He built their Sherwood home, a Prineville vacation home, and in his retirement, built a 1953 Ford pickup from the ground up. But most importantly, he and Chris built a beautiful family. His many talents, dry sense of humor and love for his family and friends will be his legacy.

He is survived by his wife Chris, to whom he was married 47 years; his three children Steve Peppmeier (Jen), Doug Peppmeier (Kelly), and Sara Hunt (Jason); eight grandchildren, Kameryn, Justyn, Matthew, Caleb (Steve); Will, Jack, Annemarie (Doug); and Tyler (Sara); and brother, Larry Peppmeier (Grace).

A memorial service will be held in Sherwood at St. Francis Catholic Church Wednesday, March 30th. Rosary will begin at 10:30 and the service will follow at 11:00. All are invited to attend a gathering following the service at the church.


