



Patricia Ann Harcourt

June 4, 1935 - August 23, 2025

Patricia (Pat) Harcourt passed away on August 23, 2025, at the age of 90.

Born in Lakeview, Oregon, Pat's childhood was spent in Sweet Home and Gresham. She attended Lewis and Clark College in Portland, a time that shaped her future when she met the love of her life, Keith Harcourt. They married during their senior year, and after graduation, Pat began her career as a second-grade teacher in Portland while Keith attended medical school.

Pat set aside her teaching career to devote herself to raising their three children, Matt, Brian, and Joyce. After Keith completed his medical training, the family moved to Pendleton, which would become their home for many years.

Pat was a dedicated volunteer throughout her time in Pendleton, serving as a Cub Scout den mother, Sunday School teacher, and Swim Team record keeper. She was an active member of the Pendleton Women's Club, PEO, and Presbyterian Women, and contributed to numerous church committees. In recognition of her deep community involvement, which included serving on the boards of the Umatilla County Historical Society and the Pendleton Foundation Trust, Pat was named Pendleton's Woman of the Year in 1981. After retiring, Pat and Keith moved to the Oregon coast, which became their base for travel and enjoying the coastal wildlife. They later settled into a retirement community in Newberg. Pat's spirit of volunteerism continued in both communities through her involvement in PEO, roles at the Newport and Newberg Presbyterian churches, and her work within the retirement community.

Pat was preceded in death by her beloved husband, Keith. She leaves behind her children, two grandchildren, four great-grandchildren, and her brother and sister. A service to celebrate Pat's life will be held at 10:00am on September 27th at the First Presbyterian Church in Newberg, Oregon.
