



## Patsy Dean Sherman

September 15, 1928 - February 12, 2023

Patsy Dean Sherman was born in Red Fork, Oklahoma on September 15, 1928. She went to be with her Lord and Savior on February 12, 2023 in Newberg, Oregon.

Pat was from a family of 12 siblings, living through the Great Depression years. At 18, she married Marvin Sherman after he returned from WWII. They moved to Portland, Oregon to be closer to her parents Clabe and Pearl Stewart. Their oldest daughter Teresa was born while they lived in Portland. They moved to the San Juan Islands to start a church youth camp. Having their youngest daughter Janell, the family returned to Portland in 1962.
