Queen Zita Togiaï, 53, of Tualatin passed away on April 16th, 2024 surrounded by her siblings and nieces and nephews.

Queen Zita Togiaï was born to Reupena and Tautalamoto Togiaï on December 24, 1970 in San Francisco. She was the youngest of 13 children.

Queen grew up in Daly City in the bay area. After graduating from El Camino High School she attended College of San Mateo where she studied Business Management. Queen went on to pursue a successful career in international business focusing on Logistics and Supply Chain Management. As a manager, she was skilled at collaborating with diverse individuals and cultures, and this enabled her to travel throughout the world: Thailand, Singapore, China, South America, Europe and domestically in the USA. She enjoyed traveling but San Francisco is where she left her heart. Queen gave back to her community through volunteering at Tualatin High School in their College and Career Center as an ASPIRE mentor, and the Pacific Islander Club; she also participated in the outreach efforts of The Transition Project Inc. of Portland, serving those in transition from homelessness in housing.

Fiercely independent, Queen never married and her life was deeply enriched by her pets who preceded her in death: Pele, a black Labrador and her cat, Miss Kitty, that she adopted while living in Houston. The humans who surrounded and loved her were her siblings, nieces and nephews, extended family members and numerous friends. Queen was loved dearly and will be missed by them all.

A celebration of her life is in the planning stage and family will send out direct notifications. Donations can be made in remembrance of Queen during this time.

Her wishes were cremation and her family will scatter her ashes in San Francisco at a future date.

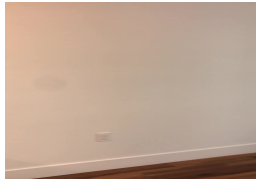
