



Ray Arthur Hopp

December 4, 1924 - June 15, 2012

On graduation from school Ray enlisted in Marines and was sent to the South Pacific. He saw battle action on Guam, Iwo Jima, and Volcano Island, although he rarely talked about his experiences. After returning from the war in 1946 he moved to Sutherlin, OR and began a career in logging. He eventually bought a couple log trucks and moved his business back to Toledo in 1956. A subsequent back injury forced him to look for a new occupation and he found an insurance agency for sale by Bob Rummer in Newberg, OR and he bought it and began his new career as an independent insurance agent in 1958. He worked in his business for 54 years w/ his family until just a couple weeks before his death. He was one of the 12 founders of the Oregon Professional Insurance Agents Association in 1977 and was always a strong supporter. He served on many committees over the years. Ray was a 60 year member of the Masonic Lodge and BPOE and a member of the Eagles and had supported many local causes. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and instilled a love for the outdoors in his sons. He took up golf late in life and enjoyed long road to golf courses and casinos. He really valued time w/ his family. Ray married Betty Semenza in 1950. She preceded him in death on Oct. 10, 2000. He is survived by his sons, Allan (Carla) Hopp, Randy Hopp, both of Newberg and granddaughter Brittney Hopp. Redding, CA. and companion Char Rosebud Martin, Salem. He was preceded in Death by his parents Henry and Minnie Hopp, his sisters Josephine Lutz, Delores Pankowski, and Linda Long and brother Barney Hopp. A memorial service will

be held June 30 at 2 PM at Newberg Northside Community Church located at 1880 Hoskins St. A reception will immediately follow the service. Pastor David Case will lead the service. A private interment will be at Valley View Memorial. Funeral services arranged by Attrell's Funeral home.
