February 28, 1955 - August 14, 2023

Robyn Todd Eastman of Tualatin Oregon passed away unexpectedly on Monday, August 14th, 2023. Robyn was 68 years young. Robyn was born in Twin Falls, Idaho on February 28th, 1955 to Lucy Pauline and Bobby Loren Eastman.

As a child the family moved frequently due to his father's career. They moved from Twin Falls, Idaho to Great Falls, Montana. Later they moved to The Dalles, Oregon and he finished his high school years in Wilsonville Oregon. He graduated from West Linn High School in 1973. It is while living in Wilsonville, Oregon that he met the love of his life, Sandy Bennett, at a local restaurant where she was working as a waitress while attending College. Robyn and Sandy were married at First Baptist Church in Portland Oregon on Saturday, February 25th, 1978 by the groom's cousin, Rev. Duane Eastman. Robyn and Sandy were married for a wonderful 45 years, until the day of his passing. They lived in Oregon for their entire marriage. They were blessed with 2 beautiful children. Sarah Beth on August 7th, 1980 followed by Tyler Jay on May 16th, 1985. Robyn worked in the lumber industry all of his adult life. He recently retired on January 1st 2023.

Robyn and Sandy loved adventure & traveling. They went zip lining in Costa Rica, Hawaii and Mexico. Swam with Sting Rays while visiting the Caribbean, and with the dolphins in Florida. They loved taking trips with their group of

close friends and family in their 5th wheel RV. Robyn loved riding his ATV and enjoyed his recently purchased electric bikes. He could fix anything but did not like being called "the handyman". He took pride in his home. He loved working with wood, whether it was building decks, or remodeling his home. Most important to Robyn was his faith, and spending time with his wife, Grandchildren, family and friends. Robyn lived life to the fullest. Robyn had an amazing memory and never forgot a face or friend. He was blessed to have lifelong friends that he treasured, some that he has known since grade school.

Robyn was preceded in death by his parents Bobby Loren and Lucy Pauline, sister, Theresa Lynn VanderSanden and his granddaughter Harriett. He is survived by his wife Sandy Eastman, Daughter Sarah Carey (Jason) son Tyler Eastman, 6 grandchildren, Sawyer, Maverick, Rowan, Harper, Pearl & Penny and brother, Casey.
