Sarah Anne Marvin peacefully passed and went to be with Jesus early on the morning of May 6th with her husband, John Marvin by her side.

Sarah was born on January 3, 1956, in Kingston Jamaica to Vernon Washington Robinson and Leila Violet (Lynch) Robinson. She worked in her parents' pharmacies and had a fashion design business creating one-of-a-kind outfits. She lived in Jamaica until she was 30 where she met her husband in the Seattle area. She was married to John Marvin on August 6th, 1986.

Sarah, with her husband John and children, David Marvin, and Phillip Marvin started their ministry as children's pastors in Newberg, Oregon then went on to be youth pastors in Canby, Oregon and then pioneered a church in Botany Bay, Jamaica where they were also administrators of Harvest Hill Christian School in Botany Bay, Jamaica.

Her next role was working with her husband as a missionary in Antigua & Barbuda in the Eastern Caribbean.

Sarah was passionate about making a difference in other's lives but held special place in her heart for Pastor's wives. As missionaries on the islands of Jamaica and Antigua and Barbuda they pioneered three churches. Sarah worked alongside John in all ministries and was involved in children's ministry, youth ministry, and women's ministry.

Sarah graduated with a bachelor's and master's degree from George Fox University. She achieved a master's degree in counseling and worked as a therapist at Cascadia in Portland until she decided to work along side her

husband in the family business where Sarah worked as the Assistant Director of Empowered Services, serving adults and children with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Sarah was preceded in death by her father, Vernon Washington Robinson, mother, Leila Violet (Lynch) Robinson, and her sister, Helene Smalling. She is survived by her husband, John Marvin, children, David Marvin, Phillip Marvin, Daughters-in-love, Mary Beth Marvin and Jaameah Marvin, and six grandchildren, Atreyu Tepepa, Rini Tepepa, Jordyn Marvin, Carter Marvin, Ezekiel Marvin and Aushibari Marvin. Sarah was also survived by her siblings, Vernon Washington Robinson Jr, Janet Bernard, Marjorie Robinson & Konrad Robinson.
