It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of our beloved Skip Eisenberg. He passed away peacefully on January 30, 2025.

Born in Brooklyn, New York, he was a loving husband to his wife, Sue Easterly-Eisenberg, and father to their three children, Jesse Ryan Hill and wife Brittany, Jesse David Eisenberg and wife Krystle, and Tesia Eisenberg, as well as a doting grandfather to his five grandchildren (Carter, Aubree, Adeleine, Tegan, and Mason), with another grandchild on the way. He is also survived by his younger brother, Bobby.

Skip graduated in 1971 from Clairemont High School in San Diego, CA, where he first met his wife. Skip went on to earn his F.C.C. license and became a radio DJ working across the United States in Ohio, Wyoming, and eventually Oregon.

After moving back to San Diego in the 1980s, he reconnected with Sue at a gathering and they fell in love.

Skip also worked over a decade as a restaurant manager before following his dreams and starting his own delivery business: Straight Shot Delivery.

Skip was an avid sports enthusiast, supporting the University of Oregon Ducks football team every weekend.
