



Vivian Thornburg

June 9, 1922 - September 10, 2021

Florence Vivian Thornburg passed away September 10, 2021, at the age of 99. She was born June 9, 1922, to William Lewis Hickman and Florence Thersey (Kerley) Hickman in Las Animas, Colorado. Vivian met her future husband, Hubert Thornburg at Friends Bible College (now Barclay College) in Haviland, Kansas, and they were married in 1941. Hubert joined the Coast Guard which led to various moves, followed by pastoral ministry in Kansas. In 1948 they moved to Newberg, Oregon where Hubert attended Pacific College (now George Fox University.)

In 1953, Vivian began a 22-year career teaching private kindergarten in Newberg. Around 1967, along with her sister, Leta Hickman and niece, Bonnie Jacks, Vivian opened The Sweetheart Shop, a bridal boutique in Newberg. Both Hubert and Vivian were recorded ministers in the Friends Church and shared pastoral duties for ten years at South Salem Friends church before moving back to Newberg in 1988. A beloved teacher, minister, mentor, friend, advisor, and prayer warrior, Vivian held many leadership roles in Newberg Friends Church and in Northwest Yearly Meeting.

Vivian was preceded in death by her husband, Hubert, and son, Stanley. She is survived and treasured by her daughter Karen (Roy) McConaughey, son Kent (Jeanie) Thornburg, daughter Clea (Gordon) Crisman, daughter-in-law Cathy Thornburg (Stanley), 11 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.

A private, family-only memorial service will be held December 11th, 10:30 am at Newberg Friends Church. It will be live-streamed and also available later on
