Willard (Bill) A. Piatt was born on August 10th, 1942 and passed away on August 18th, 2020 after a nine month battle with cancer. He passed away at home with his wife Christie and other family members by his side.

Bill grew up in the Coeur D'Alene, ID and Spokane, WA area. He went to Lewis and Clark High School in Spokane.

After a brief time in the Marine Corps. he came to Newberg to visit his brother. His Family moved to Newberg shortly after. Bill worked locally in the dry cleaning business, various machine and welding shops and the glazier industry. He retired from Local 740 Glaziers, Architectural Metal and Glass workers union in 2006.
